



How to do.....

Stained glass crosses

Age 3 and over

To Christians, the cross is a symbol of how much God loves us, and the lengths he went to so that we could be friends with him again. Lots of church buildings have beautiful stained glass windows reminding us of this. In very old churches they helped to tell the story of Jesus to people who weren't able to read.

You will need:

Thin card (or paper and a cereal packet); the template; scissors, tissue paper or other brightly coloured paper; glue.

What to do:

Print the template on to thin card (black if you have it). Alternatively you could print it on to paper then stick the paper on to the cereal packet.

Cut out the shaded bits to give a framework.

Cut out bits of tissue paper or other coloured paper and stick them on to the back of the template so they show through.

If you've used tissue paper, you might like to hang your cross in the window so it looks like a stained glass window. If you've used other coloured paper, you might want to stick it to your fridge or somewhere else where you will see it.

Every time you see it, remember how much God loves YOU.
